

PE and sport premium statement

Current year - September 2021 to end August 2022

Culloden Primary Academy expects to receive £22,820 in PE and sport premium for the period September 2020 to end August 2021. The school plans to spend this, or has already spent this, as follows:

- £19,382 to fund two specialist PE teachers to introduce new extended school sports, dance and fitness activities across Y1-Y6 to encourage more pupils to take up sport and physical activities outside of the PE curriculum time. To support and involve the least active children by providing more extended school sports and holiday clubs and enter and run extra sport competitions
- £3,438 on summer term PE adventurous days for all Y1 –Y6 pupils

Previous year - September 2020 to end August 2021

Culloden Primary Academy received £21,400 in PE and sport premium for the period September 2020 to end August 2021. Spending allocations are shown below, together with a brief overview of the impact on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment. Further details are available on request.

The school is ensuring that these improvements are sustainable by:

- The employment of two PE specialist teachers.
- training of support staff to support and extend the extended school provision.

Outcomes in swimming

The current/most recent Y6 cohort comprises 88 pupils.

Of these pupils:

- 58 can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
- 49 can use a range of strokes effectively.
- 55 can perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
