Re: CPA Parent/Carer Survey - Summary of outcomes

We have had the results from our parent/carer survey that 141 of you completed last November.

Thank you to all of you who completed this. We will be using the information to improve our school even further.

I have summarised the key points below under 'Strengths' and 'Areas for development' as well as outlining actions we will be taking to address these areas.

Highest scores/ Strengths

Strengths: top three results ?

87%	<p>Informing parents</p> <p>7) How informed do you feel with regard to your child's attendance?</p>
86%	<p>Parental confidence</p> <p>36) How interested would you be to receive suggestions on how to support your child's learning and development?</p>
84%	<p>Pupil needs</p> <p>28) How easy or difficult is it for your child to access the Internet at home? (This information would be valuable for teachers when planning homework.)</p>

Lowest scores/areas for development
