Dear Parent/carer,

I am pleased to inform you that after a recent two day review of the school, the trainee ToDs were given some fantastic feedback about their teaching the learning:

“The teaching and learning seen in the DSB was very effective and pupils were gaining a great deal from their lessons. Those conducted by the trainee ToDs were well structured; pupils were accessing the curriculum; and staff were effectively enabling the pupils to lip read and sign proficiently. Practical apparatus was used really well, for example in mathematics, to help pupils understand the importance of partitioning and place value”.

Over the next couple of weeks we are trialling for another BSL TA to join the school. We have numerous people interested in this position. We will inform parents once a suitable person is in post.

We are also pleased to announce that a BSL lunchtime club has been set up. This will be an opportunity for pupils to learn BSL at lunchtime. The club is run by two DSB teaching assistants.

Please see below dates of the next open classroom session, where you will be able to see your child's books and spend time with them in their classroom. I would encourage all parents to attend.

We also look forward to welcoming you all at the coffee morning on the 22nd October.

Finally, senior advisors from The Ewing Foundation will be visiting Culloden before the end of this half term. They will be working closely with the ToDs. This is another great opportunity for the school to receive external professional advice for the pupils and staff so that we can continue to ensure we are delivering effective teaching and learning.
