P.E.: This half term PE shall be taught every **Friday morning**. Pupils can come into school on a Friday morning in their PE kits, but **must** bring their school uniform to change into when their lesson finishes.

Shared reading: This term we are reading *Emil and the Detectives*, and *The Tempest*. Each lesson we look at new vocabulary, read several pages of the book together as a class and answer comprehension and inference style questions associated with the text.

Writing: This term we will have a focus on poetry in our Literacy and writing lessons. The pupils will study a range of types of poetry and create their own poems surrounding different themes, including their own identities.

Maths: We shall begin by reintroducing 3 digit numbers, then move onto 4 digit numbers, looking at the value of each digit using physical manipulatives to facilitate this learning. Following this, the class will then attempt adding and subtracting using the column method.

Science: We shall be looking at States of Matter. We will also be basing some non-fiction writing around some of these topics.

Humanities: The first half term will see the classes learn about the Romans, specifically what the UK was like before, during and after the Roman invasion and who revolted against them.

Computing: The children are learning to be programmers and create their own games using coding strategies taught by a specialist computing teacher (**Paul Greengrass**).

PSHE: The first two topics will be 'Being me' which will focus on confidence and appreciation of themselves and others, and 'Dreams and Goals' where pupils will discuss their aspirations and goals for the future. These lessons are designed to help pupils develop their emotional and social skills.

Music: Specialist music teachers (**Carys, Karen and Lydia**) will teach the pupils Music at various times throughout the week.

Homework: Homework will be given online every Friday. Pupils will need to complete this in their homework books and bring it back in by the following **Tuesday**. Pupils in Year 4 are also expected to practice with TTRS every day for 15 minutes. It is particularly important children practice as they undertake a government Multiplication Check test in the Summer term.

Pupils **must read everyday for a minimum of 15 minutes** with a small summary of what they have read in their reading records each day.

Reading Plus: Children will be completing one hour per week of Reading Plus. This is an online resource which helps to monitor and challenge children to develop their reading and vocabulary skills.
