SCHOOL LEARNING



Here are photos of the children sorting real life objects and sticking them in according to their shape!

The highlight of Maths this term has been learning shapes. Watching the children become "shape detectors!" They moved beyond the classroom blocks and began identifying 3D shapes in everyday objects. This helped them understand that math isn't just a lesson—it's everywhere! Some of their favourite discoveries included:

Comparing our round playballs to the oranges at snack time.

Noticing that our glue sticks and rolling pins share the same smooth, curved shape.

Realising that their favorite storybooks and cereal boxes are the same shape as our building blocks.

By linking these abstract shapes to familiar items, the children are building a much stronger memory of their properties. It was wonderful to hear them exclaiming, "Look! My water bottle is a cylinder!" as they applied their new vocabulary to the world around them.
