Sun, Smiles, and Celebrations!

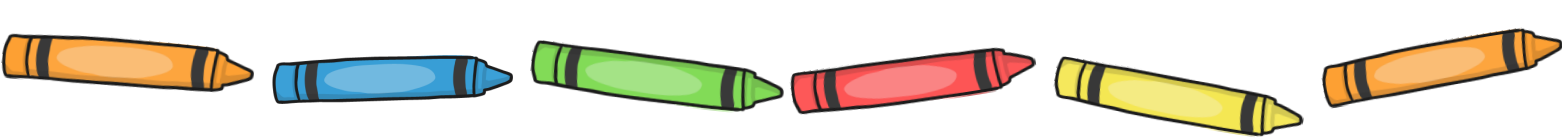
What a spectacular, jam-packed end to the school year we have had in Nursery!
